New PLS Outstanding Chapter Advisor Award

So much of a chapter's focus and drive comes from their advisor. This year for the first time PLS has designed an award to highlight the achievement that a wonderful advisor brings to a PLS chapter.

PHI LAMDA SIGMA OUTSTANDING CHAPTER ADVISOR AWARD

Description

The Phi Lambda Sigma Outstanding Chapter Advisor Award was established in 2005 to recognize an advisor of a Phi Lambda Sigma chapter who has promoted student leadership, actively contributed to the achievements of their local chapter, and served in leadership roles in the profession and/or the community.

Criteria:

The nominee must:

- 1) be a member of Phi Lambda Sigma
- 2) have been an active chapter advisor for at least one year
- 3) have actively promoted student leadership;
- 4) made significant contributions to achievements of the chapter
- 5) served in leadership roles in the profession and/or the community
- 6) must not be a past recipient of the award.

Nomination Process

The nominator is responsible for completing the nomination form and submitting the award nomination packet. The deadline for nomination materials is January 31 annually. The nomination packet is to include the following items:

- 1) Nomination form
- 2) Three letters of recommendation; one from the Dean, one from a Phi Lambda Sigma faculty member, and one from a Phi Lambda Sigma collegiate member
- 3) A current CV or resume

Selection Process:

The selection for the award is made by the Phi Lambda Sigma Awards committee based on careful review of complete nominations.

Nature of Award:

Winner of the award receives a distinctive gift and a \$500 cash prize for the chapter. Both are presented at the Phi Lambda Sigma Awards Banquet in conjunction with APHA Annual Meeting.

Award Background: This annual award focuses on the mission of Phi Lambda Sigma, recognizing and promoting leadership in our profession of pharmacy. This upcoming year the grant for the award recipient has been increased to \$1000.

The Beta Gamma chapter organized a two day workshop for students of multiple health science disciplines. Their focus was on develop leadership while creating patient-care programs for implementation in community health sites, encouraging long-term awareness of community needs, and reinforcing the strengths of each health discipline.

The workshop was broken into two days spent at an overnight campsite. Day one focused on

motivational speakers and team building activities. During day two participants brainstormed and began to implement program ideas for the community. The focus of the programs designed were based on the Healthy People 2010 focus.

The group also plans to meet six months after the retreat to focus on achievements and additional opportunities from the conference.

Award Background: This award was designed to encourage PLS members to pursue their PhD. in a college of Pharmacy Graduate Program.

Ryan received his Doctor of Pharmacy degree from Ohio Northern University in May of

2005. While in pharmacy school Ryan was active in many organizations including Rho Chi, Phi Kappa Phi, Phi Eta Sigma, Sigma Xi, and Kappa Psi. He was also as Vice President for both the Pharmacy Student Council and APhA-ASP.

His first research began his third year of pharmacy school researching consumer perceptions of brand vs. generic pharmaceuticals.

He worked on a fellowship under the Merck Research Scholar Program and his mentor Dr. David Kinder studying, "Use of a Novel Cell Culture Technique to Study the Role of Celecoxib in Cell Death." This research is currently in the process of being prepared for a manuscript for publication.

Ryan has future goals to give back to the pharmacy community by teaching and remaining active in his research.
